DRIVE-UP WINDOW AVAILABLE SOON



The drive-up window is an express lane where you can quickly pick up your reserved materials without getting out of your car. It's located next to the drive-up book return. Other services are not available through the drive-up window at this time.

How do I use the service?

1. Place an item on hold and select "Beloit Public Library Drive Up" as your pickup location.
2. When you receive notice that your item is ready and available for pick up, pull up to our window and ring the bell. Be sure to bring your library card.

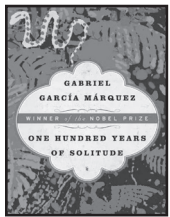

Accessibility

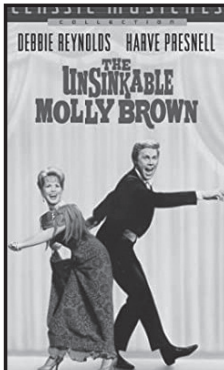
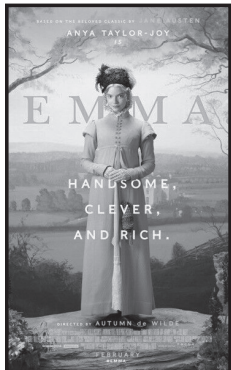
